SUBJECT: Downtown ADA Ramps and Driveway Project

Dear Neighbor,

Communication is a key component in creating and preserving partnerships between citizens and the City of Tucson. In keeping with this long-standing commitment, the City of Tucson Department of Transportation (TDOT) is notifying you of an upcoming project to install new ADA-compliant ramps, sidewalks and driveways in the Downtown area.

The improvements will occur in staggered phases between Saturday, February 16, 2019 and Friday, May 31, 2019. Granite Construction, under contract with TDOT, will make these improvements at various existing ramps at the following locations:

Alameda Street – Church Avenue to Sixth Avenue
Broadway – Sixth Avenue to Fourth Avenue
Congress Street – Fifth Avenue to Toole Avenue
Sixth Avenue – Toole Avenue to Congress Street

During this work, pedestrian access to businesses and residences will not be affected; however, access to ramps and driveways under construction will be prohibited. Curb lane travel restrictions will be in place during the work.

PROJECT CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Saturday, February 16 to Tuesday, February 19 – Reconstruct ramps at Wells Fargo Parking Garage, 38 E. Alameda St. **The parking garage will be closed from 7 p.m. on Friday, February 15 through 6 a.m. on Tuesday, February 19.** Work hours will be 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Tuesday, February 19 through mid-April – Reconstruct various ramps on Alameda Street from Church Avenue to Sixth Avenue. Crews will work Monday through Friday, from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., as well as some weekends.

As construction moves forward through May, construction updates will be provided through email notification and door-to-door contact.
